DEP Updates

- Permit administration
 - No updates on PY1 annual report comments, annual report template, or audits
 - EPA held a meeting with state officials, they're still looking into who will be designated new MS4
- LID ordinance permit modification
 - Proposed permit modification open for public comment through April 18
 - o Implementation deadline extended through October 1, 2025, relying on Chapter 500 process to provide LID standards for permit & ordinance
 - Expecting LID standards to be in front of the Board in June, Gregg will be coordinating with Kerem

- Some communities must put ordinance on municipal ballots to approve, need timeline extended to after November 4, 2025, otherwise the ordinances must be ready for elections this fall
- o State & Federal permittees, will be complying with existing Appendix F, permit not reopened
- Draft Revised Maine Construction General Permit
 - Current MCGP standards are embedded in permit, permittees will be held to those standards during this permit period, still beneficial to cross check new standards for future applications

PY3 Budget

- Municipal: \$14,491.40; Nested: \$5,651.65
- Permit negotiations and training over past 4.5 years = \$128,683 ISWG funds; the highest amount in one permit year was PY8 = ~\$44,500, current carry forward is ~\$46,300. The municipalities were also invoiced separately by GPCOG for additional money during this time.
- There were also two Maine Coastal Community grants used to prepare the ESC ordinance and the model LID ordinance:
 - 2020 grant amount (ESC): \$32,550
 - o 2021 grant amount (LID): \$35,245
